## Go Inside Miami's Most Expensive Hotel Suites

Long a playground for the rich and famous, <u>Miami</u> boasts some of the most luxurious hotels on the East Coast, if not in the entire country. With the world's largest concentration of <u>Art Deco</u> buildings and a wealth of midcentury design, the city is a treasure trove of architectural gems, many of which have been reborn as in-demand accommodations. ## The Betsy South Beach

Following last year's expansion, the Betsy has just debuted the loft-style Skyline Penthouse Suite in its new Art Deco wing. Decked out in white and ocean blue, the 900-square-foot suite boasts a baby grand piano, hardwood floors, a chandelier in the master bedroom, a kitchenette, and a spacious bathroom with a stealth LCD TV concealed in the mirror. A large wraparound terrace offers atrium and city views. Guests can add on up to three additional bedrooms connected by a private vestibule for more than 3,000 square feet of space in the heart of South Beach's Art Deco District. *thebetsyhotel.com; from \$2,000 per night*
