The Betsy South Beach

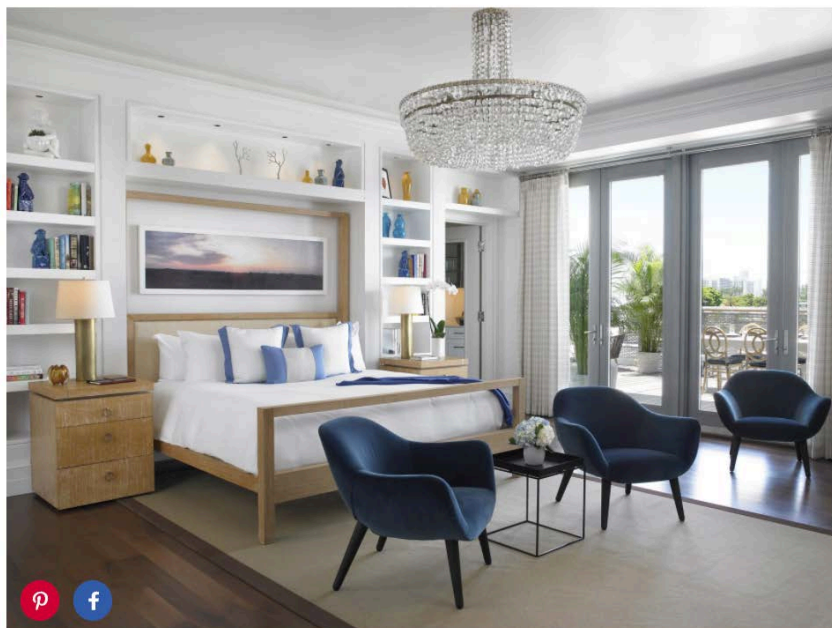

Following last year's expansion, the Betsy has just debuted the loft-style Skyline Penthouse Suite in its new Art Deco wing. Decked out in white and ocean blue, the 900-square-foot suite boasts a baby grand piano, hardwood floors, a chandelier in the master bedroom, a kitchenette, and a spacious bathroom with a stealth LCD TV concealed in the mirror. A large wraparound terrace offers atrium and city views. Guests can add on up to three additional bedrooms connected by a private vestibule for more than 3,000 square feet of space in the heart of South Beach's Art Deco District. thebetsyhotel.com; from \$2,000 per night
