Art Deco Digs

The Betsy-South Beach, a gem of Floridian-Georgian architecture, has completed its new "Art Deco" wing within its former next-door neighbor, the Carlton Hotel. Miami architect Allan T. Shulman of Shulman + Associates and designers Diamante Pedersoli and Carmelina Santoro led the twoyear charge, connecting the contrasting edifices via Española Way and 14th Place. The Betsy's PACE (Philanthropy, Arts, Culture and Education) program continues its legacy with two public installations: The Orb, a silver dome that encapsulates the overhead hotel bridgeway, and The Poetry Rail, where words by proponents for Miami literature are etched into metal.
